On May 13th 1940 a beautiful child was born in Fort William, West Moreland Jamaica. She is the daughter of Lillian Hill and Charles Alexander Drummond, and sister of Wesley, Loretta, Lynford, Caroline, Samuel, Bethune and William.

They named her Eugenie Icilda Drummond, translated... "born well to evoke righteousness, decisiveness and humility".

At an early age she was introduced to God and was raised in Fort William Assemblies Of Holiness Baptist Church, where her faith in God blossomed.

She attended Petersfield School, where she told stories of her favourite teacher Ms Flowers. How Ms Flowers would place books on her head and taught her how to walk like a lady that helped groom her into the young woman she became, with etiquette and style.

After her studies, she became a Secretarial worker.

She loved her early years in Jamaica and spoke fondly of her parents, siblings, friends and all the adventures they went through.

At the age of 19, Ms Eugenie Icilda Drummond decided it was time to spread her wings and see what the world had to offer.

After arriving in England and after the initial shock of the cold weather, she soon settled in, studied and found work as a registered nurse.
