“*Natalie's full obituary: Natalie Tafari Tabois made her debut into this world on September 11, 1976, at Long Island Jewish Hospital in New Hyde Park, New York. Her parents were Owen Tabois and Cynthia Campbell Tabois.*

Our heavenly Father called His beautiful angel home on October 8, 2013. She was 37 years old.

Natalie – who lived in Forest Hills, New York with her beloved and extremely spoiled puggle, Sammy Davis Jr. Jr. (that's not a typo, that is his name) – grew up in Sunrise and Plantation, graduating from Piper High School in 1994.

She attended colleges in Broward and Tallahassee, before joining the U. S. Air Force in 1996, following her younger brother Brandon's footsteps. Although her father initially was not happy with her decision to enter the service, it proved to be a pivotal decision. Natalie had big plans and this was the first of many solid stepping stones to her wonderful future. And her father was very pleased with her decision.

While based at Hanscom AFB in Boston, she continued her education at the University of Massachusetts at Lowell. After leaving the Air Force, she eventually landed at the Veterans Administration New York Harbor Healthcare System as a projects manager in the Information Technology Department.
